Let's Paint the Streets is a hyper-local placemaking initiative rooted in community storytelling. With a coalition of 16 local artists, 20 utility boxes were transformed into public works of art. The collection exhibits an array of styles, ranging from abstract fine art to subjective illustration. As the artwork was printed on vinyl to then wrap the boxes, LPS was able to welcome artists of different disciplines, whether graffiti artists or graphic designers, given the digitization capability. The collection of 20 art boxes was created with the theme of Transformation and Rebirth, based on the community's history and evolution as its undergone gripping change.
